Since the average U.S. worker now earns a record annual wage of \$594.00, many members of the House felt that five cents for a loaf of bread was quite affordable.

Vice-President James S. Sherman noted that while ten pounds of potatoes had risen to nineteen cents, he said that the American public had, in 1909, more buying power than ever before.

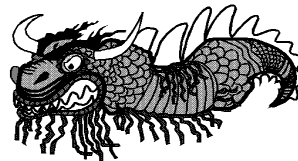

Astronomers Note Waxing Gibbous Moon

U.S. NAVAL OBSERVATORY - Heralding the birth of Amber Davis was the waxing gibbous moon. Because Amber was also born during the month of January, this moon is also known as a so-called "Wolf Moon".

Today, Friday, the Moon appears to be more than one-half but not fully illuminated by direct sunlight. The fraction of the Moon's disk that is illuminated is increasing. This Moon can be seen after the First Quarter Moon, but before the Full Moon. The amount of the Moon that we can see will grow larger and larger every day. (Waxing means increasing, or growing larger.)
