Vice-President Alben W. Barkley noted that while ten pounds of potatoes had risen to seventy-six cents, he said that the American public had, in 1952, more buying power than ever before.

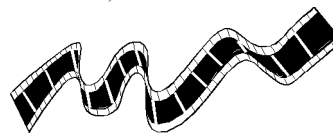
