Since the average U.S. worker now earns a record annual wage of \$6,249.00, many members of the House felt that twenty-two cents for a loaf of bread was quite affordable.

Vice-President Lyndon B. Johnson noted that while ten pounds of potatoes had risen to sixty-three cents, he said that the American public had, in 1963, more buying power than ever before.
