Vice-President Hubert H. Humphrey noted that while ten pounds of potatoes had risen to ninety-four cents, he said that the American public had, in 1965, more buying power than ever before.

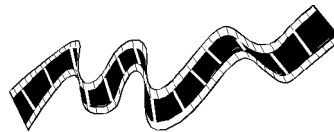
