Split along party lines, many Republicans felt that fifty-seven cents for a half gallon of milk was a solid consumer bargain, while Democrats pointed out that eighty-four cents for a pound of bacon was too expensive for many. Since the average U.S. worker now earns a record annual wage of \$7,933.00, many members of the House felt that twenty-two cents for a loaf of bread was quite affordable.

Vice-President Hubert H. Humphrey noted that while ten pounds of potatoes had risen to seventy-five cents, he said that the American public had, in 1967, more buying power than ever before.
